\* If you encounter any words whose definition you don't know, like Collectivist, or whose usage is unfamiliar, like being a True Blue American, please see the web site's American Lexicon.

The Lexicon responds to the fact that one reason Collectivists have accumulated so much power, so easily, has been how easily they are able to train Republicans/Conservatives to abandon plain-spoken American, and submit to words invented, and constantly muddled, by Collectivists.

Some of myriad examples:
